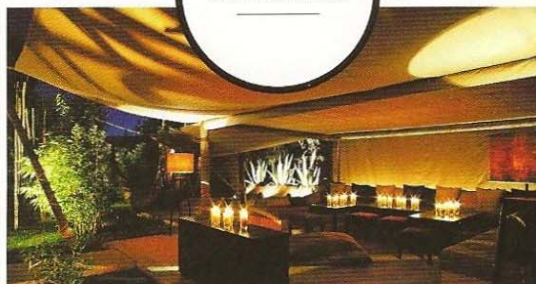
360 MALL
